CHRIST-MINDED

We are transformed by the renewing of our mind (Rom 12:2), by which we are reconciled to God (2 Cor 5:17-20), and so we have the mind of Christ (1 Cor 2:16).

Spiritual maturity is evidenced by being rightly related to God.

HOW TO KNOW GOD

- Historical accounts, Bible stories, His personality on display
- Personal interactions, character development, watch and wonder
- Ask Him, listening prayer, worship, meditation

ONENESS WITH GOD

When you are rightly related to God, it is a life of freedom and liberty and delight. You are God's will, and all your common-sense decisions are His will for you unless He checks. You decide things in perfect delightful friendship with God, knowing that if your decisions are wrong, He will always check; when He checks, stop at once. - Oswald Chambers
